• Students who are either considering a NURS, Biology, or Chemistry major are encouraged to take Math 121 to fulfill the math requirement for all three majors and Biology 121 for NURS and Biology. Chemistry 127 and 128 are in sequence.

• Admission and Progression Notes: Applications for admission will be available at the end of fall semester or the beginning of the spring semester.

Admission and Progression Requirements for the NURS Major:

- 1. Applications received after the deadline will be considered only if the cohort is not filled. If the application deadline is extended due to an unfilled cohort, applicants may complete prerequisite (Selective GPA) and qualified applicants will be considered on a rolling admission basis.
 - * Designated courses during Summer Session I prior to the application deadline posted. (See GPA notes)
- 2. Course marked with a ** designation must be completed prior to the fall semester of the traditional junior year for the NURS major. The other core courses are to be completed during the years listed to fulfill the baccalaureate degree requirements.
- 3. Students accepted for Early/Direct Admission must retain a GPA of 3.5 or higher through the full first year and complete the required coursework. Early/Direct admit students will be notified of the admission process by their NURS faculty advisors.
- 4. Students must be eligible for sophomore standing by the end of the semester of application to the major.
- 5. Transfer courses must meet the equivalency requirements as listed for the college. This includes lab experiences for each of the biology and chemistry courses, and oral and written communication courses at the 110 level (not 101). NURS courses are not transferrable.

GPA for Admission to the Major:

- 1. Consideration for admission is based on the following GPA (selective and cumulative) requirements:
 - a. A cumulative GPA of 2.8/4.0 or higher for all post high school coursework completed by the end of the semester of the application deadline is required. Students accepted for Early/Direct Admission see above section.
 - b. Coursework (or Concordia College Registrar approved course equivalents) that must be completed by the end of the semester of the application deadline for the selective GPA of 3.0/4.0 or higher includes the following * designated courses:
 - Biology 121 (preferred) or Biology 101
 - Chemistry 142, Chemistry 127 and Chemistry 128, or Chemistry 127 and Chemistry 142,
 - Intro to Oral Communications (COM) 110
 - Writing to Engage/English 110 (ENG 110)
 - Psychology 111

Academic Requirements for Progression in the Major:

- 1. A cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher must be retained through 2nd semester (end of sophomore year) of the nursing major to progress in the major.
- 2. All pre-requisite or co-requisite courses (or Concordia College Registrar approved course equivalents) and NURS courses must be completed with a letter grade of "C-"or better to progress in the major. These ** designated courses include the following:
 - Math K
 - Biology 207
 - Biology 306
 - Psychology 206
 - Sociology (and must also include an "S" designation)
 - Nutrition 321
- 3. Nursing students are required to notify the Nursing Department Chair of any pre-requisite or co-requisite final grades that are less than the minimum C- (75%).
