

The 2023 Faith, Reason and World Affairs Symposium, "Creating the Visual Record," Sept. 19-20, 2023, will focus on the ways visual documentation and storytelling are at the heart of global communication and culture.

The symposium will bring together experts in photojournalism and visual culture to explore the issues of ethics, accuracy, bias, entertainment vs. shock value, community standards, new technologies, using images to promote activism, and more. Speakers include Whitney Latorre, former director of Visuals and Immersive Experiences at National Geographic; Lauren Walsh, director of the Gallatin Photojournalism Lab at New York University and director of Lost Rolls America, a national archive of photography and memory; and Ami Vitale, National Geographic photographer and founder of Vital Impacts. The concurrent sessions will offer workshops and lectures by area experts. Students will be asked to document the event with images posted to a livestream throughout the day. The symposium will conclude with a panel discussion featuring our guest speakers.

Jonathan Johnson is a photographer and filmmaker whose work explores ideas about place, identity and nature. Autobiography plays a role in Johnson's work as he often references his mixed-race background, travel and backcountry exploration. Johnson collaborates with composers, writers, poets, designers and fellow artists in his artwork that takes the form of photographic prints, books, films, videos and teaching projects.

Johnson has received several awards and grants and his work has been shown at film festivals and galleries in more than 30 countries. Previously, Johnson was a competitive ski racer and held positions in the music industry and public affairs.

Mixtape: Landscape is a new survey featuring various types of photography, including darkroom experiments, video, and large-scale color prints that focus on landscape, place, and autobiography. Much of the work was created during artist residencies in Thailand. Scotland and Sweden.

Native American artist, Anna Johnson, seeks to bridge the gap between the world she lives in and the culture she comes from. When she feels or experiences discrimination, she is moved to make a difference through her work; she addresses topics like religion, spirituality and the social injustices that Native Americans, women, and LGBTQ+ people face. Johnson is an enrolled member of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians. She received her BFA in printmaking and drawing from NDSU and has been creating art here in Fargo and across the state since graduation.

Evolution utilizes natural materials and animal stencils in monotype prints. Johnson wishes to show the respect that Indigenous people hold for sacred medicines. She also utilizes collages which include maps of North Dakota and her reservation and floral beadwork that combine Cree/Ojibwe designs.
