HONORING OUR ALUMNI

The National Alumni Board recognizes alumni who are notably carrying out the mission of the college and who have distinguished themselves in their careers and service to others by conferring upon them the Alumni Achievement Award (alumni of more than 20 years) and the Sent Forth Award (alumni of less than 20 years). We also honor alumni of any age who are devoted to local community service with the Called to Serve Award.

2024 Sent Forth Award Recipients



Erin Campbell '04 was named commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget in August 2023 and has since been leading the state agency. She served on Gov. Mark Dayton's transition team and has taken on numerous leadership roles throughout her time as a public servant, earning numerous honors. She has also served as a board member at Avenues for Homeless Youth and served on the District Energy Board of Directors.



Dr. Alex Ritter '09 is a senior scientist in cell and tissue reprogramming with Altos Labs in Redwood City, California, where he applies quantitative imaging approaches to visualize and measure certain effects on biological systems, with a focus on live imaging of immune cells killing cancer cells. He is deeply engaged in science outreach, contributing to Concordia academics throughout his career through delivering numerous lectures and serving on advisory boards. Ritter remains active in the arts, creating sculpted-glass models of cell biology.

2024 Called to Serve Recipients



Kathryn (Johnson) Benson '64 retired in 2018 after 50 years of service to Concordia College. Benson started at Concordia as a hall director before becoming a staff nurse in the campus health center and then health center administrator, where she served for 40 years. Her commitment to service reaches beyond the college, where she has served on the YWCA Cass-Clay Board of Directors and on the YWCA National Board, and has been an active member of Trinity Lutheran church. Benson has been recognized for her commitment, earning the YWCA Woman of the Year in Health, Concordia's Ole and Lucy Flaatt Distinguished Service Award, and the Soli Deo Gloria Award.



Carlton Urdahl '63 is a retired educator who taught for 60 years. Throughout his extensive career he taught math at two schools — Granite Falls for 10 years and Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose Schools for 50, earning the Teacher of Excellence Award at Buffalo High School. Urdahl's passion for service reaches beyond the classroom, where he has been on numerous mission trips, delivered food for Meals on Wheels, and always finds a choir to sing with.

2024 Alumni Achievement Award Recipients



Col. Jeffrey Greenwood '95 Retired Col. Jeffrey “Cap” Greenwood '95 served a combined 28 years in the U.S. Air Force and the U.S. Space Force, establishing the first space detachment at the U.S. Air Force Academy and serving as its initial space commander. He was a master space officer with three command tours, serving in a variety of operational and staff positions, tours on the Air Staff and Joint Staff, was an instructor at Army War College, and is a two-time combat veteran of Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan).



Eric Jackson '88 is a board director and strategic advisor for Lube-Tech. Previously, he served as its CEO and president for 18 years, overseeing significant growth through both acquisition and expansion. His business experience includes roles with ConAgra Foods and Ernst & Young, as well as owning and operating a grocery store. He is a founding member of Next Level Partners, a network of philanthropists, sparked the launch of Leadership Roundtable – Twin Cities, and served as a founding partner of Social Venture Partners Minnesota.



Dr. Arthur Molvik '64 retired from his position as a physicist at the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory in California in 2007, following 35 years of contributions to physics and technology — including progress toward controlled thermonuclear fusion. After retiring, he continued working as a lab associate. His publications include collaborations with scientists at CERN, the Budker Institute of Nuclear Physics, and the GSI Helmholtz Centre for Heavy Ion Research. He is a fellow of the American Physical Society and a referee for multiple physics journals.



Dr. Margaret Semrud-Clikeman '72 professor emerita of pediatrics and retired division director of pediatric behavioral neuroscience at the University of Minnesota Twin Cities, has performed critical research on attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, autism, learning and developmental disabilities, and educational neuroscience. She has published more than 60 articles, 75 chapters, and six textbooks and given more than 200 presentations at national and international conferences. She served in various editorial posts for multiple academic journals.



ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES



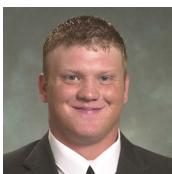
Morgan Bain Hirsch '07 is one of only four players in the history of the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference to earn multiple MIAC Player of the Year honors. Conference MVP in 2004 and 2006, Hirsch was a driving force behind the Cobbers' first MIAC regular-season championship in 2006. She was a three-time National Soccer Coaches Association of America All-Region honoree and one of only a few players to earn All-Conference honors in four straight seasons. She still holds the school record in goals scored in a career.



Micah Benson '00 was the last Cobber to participate in three sports in a single academic year — soccer, basketball, and track & field. Benson was a two-time NCAA Outdoor Meet participant in track & field, a three-time MIAC champion in the long jump, and conference winner in the high jump. He was also an All-Conference Honorable Mention selection in soccer, helping Concordia win the MIAC championship in 1996. Benson was a 3-year member of the Cobber basketball team and led the squad in assists in 1998.



Nic Didier '05 earned Associated Press Little All-American, American Football Coaches Association All-American, D3football.com All-American and Football Gazette All-American honors in his senior season for the Cobber football team in 2004. He was also named the MIAC Most Outstanding Lineman (Mike Stam Award) after leading the Concordia offensive line that helped the Cobbers win the MIAC championship and advance to the second round of the NCAA playoffs. Didier, captain of the 2004 Cobber squad, was selected to play in the Division III All-Star game.



Joshua Dietz '05 was a captain of the Cobber football team that won the MIAC Championship in 2004. He was one of the leaders on the defense that finished the conference with an unbeaten record and went on to advance to the second round of the NCAA playoffs. Dietz was named to the Football Gazette All-American Team in 2004 as well as earning All-Conference honors in three straight seasons. He is still second on the school's all-time list for solo tackles and third in total tackles.



Rebecca (Shane) Jorgenson '07 was the main attacking presence for the Cobber volleyball team from 2003-06. She earned American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American honors in 2004 and 2006, was a two-time All-Region honoree and the only player in program history to be named AVCA Region First-Year Player of the Year. Jorgenson also garnered MIAC honors, helping Concordia win the 2006 MIAC regular-season championship and the 2003, 2004, and 2006 postseason titles. She was named MIAC Most Valuable Player in 2006 — one of only three in program history.



Doug Perry '65 was a two-sport athlete at Concordia. He was part of the 1964 Cobber football team that won the MIAC title and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics National Co-Championship, and a team co-captain of the Cobber track & field squad in 1965. After graduating, Perry returned to Concordia, staying nearly 30 years — serving as an assistant coach for the football program for 27 years, as head coach for the men's and women's track & field teams, and as head coach of the wrestling squad.
