

# Concordia College Community Achievement Scholarship Policy

## 1) Tuition & Fees

- a) This scholarship covers full tuition for up to 17 credits per semester.
  - i) Any overload credit charges are the responsibility of the student.
- b) This scholarship covers the Orientation Fee, Student Activity Fee, and Technology Fee.
  - i) Special course fees, ensemble fees, music lessons, lab fees, and other individual fees are the responsibility of the student.

## 2) Room & Board

- a) This scholarship covers the full cost of a Standard Double Room plan.
  - i) Students choosing a single room or other more expensive housing option are responsible for the difference in cost between the Standard Double Room plan and the plan they choose.
  - ii) The scholarship will not cover costs for living off-campus.
- b) This scholarship covers the full cost of the Gold 255 meal plan.
  - i) Students choosing a more expensive meal plan are responsible for the difference in cost between the Gold 255 plan and the plan they choose.

## 3) Books & Supplies

- a) This scholarship does not cover books and other educational supplies. Students are responsible for the required course materials and supplies each semester.

## 4) Outside Scholarships

- a) Students receiving scholarships from organizations outside of Concordia College may use those funds to cover additional expenses such as books or fees not covered by the scholarship.
  - i) If outside scholarships cause an award to exceed the Cost of Attendance, we will reduce loans first and institutional gift aid second.

## 5) Summer School

- a) Scholarship funds cannot be used to cover summer school costs.

## 6) Study Away

- a) Scholarship funds cannot be used to cover May Seminar or other short-term study away costs.
- b) For year-long or semester-long study away, a student's regular financial aid package stays the same as if the student were studying on-campus.
  - i) Additional expenses related to study away such as travel are not covered by the scholarship.
  - ii) Required deposits for study away are the responsibility of the student and are not covered by the scholarship.

## 7) Miscellaneous

- a) Costs covered by the scholarship will be covered via a combination of institutional gift aid, federal and/or state grants.
  - i) Institutional gift aid may be renamed at any point during a students' time at Concordia College.
- b) Students must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress as defined within the college's policy which can be found on the financial aid webpage.
- c) The Community Access Scholarship is valid for 8 consecutive semesters of continuous full-time enrollment at Concordia College. If a recipient needs an exception to the 8 consecutive full-time enrollment, please contact the Center for Student Success.
