Communication Studies A.A. Transfer Pathway

This document is designed for community college students completing the Communication Studies A.A. with the intent to transfer to Concordia College and complete the Communication Studies B.A. degree. Students who do not intend to complete the A.A. degree should contact transfer@cord.edu to plan course selections for the major and the goal areas.

Below is the list of approved course work from the pathway that meets general education requirements or communication studies major requirements. All courses must be completed with a C- or better to transfer. Students who complete the MnTC and graduate with a 2.75 GPA will qualify for our admission guarantee - www.ConcordiaCollege.edu/TransferGuarantee.

Pivotal Experience in Applied Knowledge (PEAK) - one non-credit PEAK required when transferring to Concordia with junior status (<i>all PEAKs are non-credit bearing required experiences</i>)	0
Religion - REL 200 Christianity & Religious Diversity	4
LANG - World Language (second semester level or higher) Could be fulfilled by transferring one of the following courses: SPAN 1402, 2401, 2404 (additional courses may meet equivalent upon evaluation)	4-8
Additional 300/400-level courses to reach minimum of 40 senior-level credits required for the bachelor's degree	
General electives to reach minimum 126 credits for bachelor's degree

Students should be aware that they must meet the [residence requirement](#) to complete their degree at Concordia: Residence is defined as enrollment as a full-time student at Concordia College with a minimum of 12 semester credits per semester. To meet the residence requirement, candidates for a Concordia College degree must:

- Be enrolled full-time with a minimum of 12 credits per semester
- complete a minimum of 30 credits at Concordia College
- complete a minimum of 50% of major requirements and 40% of minor requirements with Concordia coursework; and
- be in residence for the two semesters preceding graduation
