President Craft announced his upcoming retirement at the end of his second presidential term, on June 30, 2023. The Board of Regents has already begun the work of seeking Concordia's next president with a presidential search committee and national consulting firm.

The project will include a nursing simulation lab and a human performance lab. It will be a remarkable advancement to the program.

Dr. Gwen Wagstrom Halaas '75 was named new dean of Sanford Heimarck School of Health Professions. Dr. Halaas brings more than four decades of research, teaching, program development and administrative experience to Concordia. She grew up in the Fargo-Moorhead area and is a 1975 graduate of Concordia. Dr. Halaas will assume the role on July 1, 2022.
