#### **Submission Process**

## Submission form

Submissions will only be accepted when accompanied by a completed submission form (both the work and the submission form must be submitted electronically to Lisa Sjoberg at sjoberg@cord.edu). Your typed name on the submission form serves as your electronic signature verifying your acceptance of the terms specified on the form and in these guidelines.

#### File formats

Please submit all files electronically to sjoberg@cord.edu. The specifications below provide guidance on file formats for various types of works. Please contact Lisa Sjoberg (sjoberg@cord.edu or 218.299.3180) to discuss alternative formats **prior** to submission.

All submissions must be in final form and adhere to proper citation format. Submissions will NOT be copy edited for grammar, spelling, format, or content.

Contributors are responsible for copyright research, including understanding the implications of placing an item in an institutional repository that may be submitted for future publication.

## **Format & Duration**

Content in Concordia Scholars: Showcase of Undergraduate Research will be distributed in electronic format in perpetuity. Authors/contributors may also publish content in traditional forms, such as journals, without limitation. Content will not be withdrawn unless legal concerns, such as copyright, libelous content, or privacy issues, arise. If an author/contributor pursues publishing the piece of scholarship elsewhere and the publisher requires the content not be published in a digital collection, the authors can request the removal of the content. Submitting materials to the collection permits migration and preservation of content.

## **Use of Content**

The material in Concordia Scholars: Showcase of Undergraduate Research may be viewed, printed, and downloaded for personal use. Users are responsible for providing proper attribution and citation. All other uses of content must be approved.

Because the goal of a digital collection is to provide open access to quality research, access to materials will not be restricted. Access will only be restricted if demanded by a publisher or to protect the future publication or patent registration of content.
