TRANSFER GUIDE FOR DAKOTA COLLEGE AT BOTTINEAU

These courses have been approved for transfer to Concordia's CORE curriculum. This is a guide only for the purpose of helping you in course selection for transferring to Concordia. Transferable courses are defined as Courses that are similar to a course offered at Concordia, in which a grade of "C-" or better was received, and have a course number 100 or above.
