She holds degrees in computer science and mathematics from Pennsylvania State University and a Ph.D. in theology from the Graduate Theological Union, Berkeley.

Some of her recent books include "The Artifice of Intelligence: Divine and Human Relationship in a Robotic Age" and "In Our Image: Artificial Intelligence and the Human Spirit." She is a co-editor of "Encountering AI: Ethical and Anthropological Investigations" and "Religious and Cultural Implications of Technology-Mediated Relationships in a Post-Pandemic World."
