Student Right-to-Know Fall 2023 Census Data





The federal Student Right-to-Know Act requires that colleges and universities publish their six-year graduation rates. Concordia's current six-year graduation rate is 72%. Meaning, of the new first-year students who enrolled at Concordia in 2017, 72% had graduated by 2023 (six years after first enrolling at Concordia). The remainder of the cohort had transferred, dropped out of college, or not yet completed their degree.

Eighty-five percent (85%) of Concordia's 2017 new first-year students, who stayed at Concordia throughout their college career, completed their degree within four years.*
