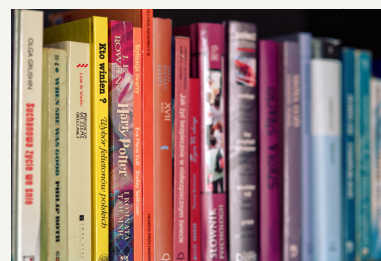
### ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

The RIDE Program pairs Concordia students as peer mentors with small groups of 8th grade students at Horizon Middle School in Moorhead to read books dealing with some aspect of identity and difference. The peer mentors and 8th graders meet together four times between Dec-Feb. The RIDE Program is PEAK eligible.
